## **Graduate Prize**

**for a Feminist Essay in 2017**

### **CALL FOR ENTRIES**

Entries are open for the 2017 *Women's Studies Journal* Graduate Prize for a Feminist Essay, awarded by the Women's Studies Association, and administered by the editorial collective of the *Women's Studies Journal*. The award will be presented to the author/s of a submitted essay that is considered by the judging panel to be the best representation of contemporary feminist scholarship. For the 2017 prize the theme is **Intersectional feminisms: New agendas for theory and activism**. We are open to a range of interpretations of this topic, and welcome submissions from all feminist graduate students.

Entries close on **1<sup>st</sup> July 2017**, and the winning essay will be announced on 1<sup>st</sup> October 2017. The award consists of a **\$500 cash prize**, and consideration for publication in the *Women's Studies Journal*.

#### **Eligibility**

To be eligible to enter, you must be enrolled in a graduate degree at a tertiary institution in Aotearoa/New Zealand at the time of writing the essay. All suitable entries will be considered, irrespective of gender identity.

#### **Entries**

The essay should be an original piece of work (although not necessarily research-based) that has not been published or accepted for publication elsewhere. The essay should be in the range of 4-5,000 words, and should follow the submission guidelines for the *Women's Studies Journal* (see <http://www.wsanz.org.nz/journal/submissions.htm>). Joint authorship is permitted, subject to both authors meeting the eligibility criteria.
